Financial Aid & Scholarships: \$644,326

In addition to both need-based and merit-based scholarship awards, funds were used to achieve gender parity in Marshall & Leventhal undergraduate programs for the 2nd year in a row.



External Communications: \$312,525

A new website which prioritizes user-experience, ease of use, and increased alumni engagement is being developed for a launch in December 2022. This new website will help to attract the best and brightest students and faculty from around the world.



Experiential Learning: \$671,247

Funds supported programming across Marshall and Leventhal. Out-of-classroom experiences are critical to deepening the development of soft skills, and to allowing our students to directly serve their communities.



New Faculty Hires: \$240,271

Donations supported the recruitment of 19 new full-time faculty members joining the Marshall and Leventhal Schools in the 2022-23 year. Each new hire brings a broad range of backgrounds and ideas to both the classroom and research collaboration.
