USC Marshall's innovative curriculum allows our undergraduates to combine in-depth knowledge of the theory and practice of business with a solid foundation in the liberal arts. The course of studies is based on the USC foundation of "breadth with depth" with a core curriculum that encompasses all the major cornerstones of business coupled with flexibility to explore courses within Marshall and within the university at-large. Within Marshall, our students have access to multiple areas of study including Accounting, Business Administration, Business of Cinematic Arts. and the World Bachelor in Business. This year sees the launch of two new joint degrees: BS AI for Business, in partnership with the Viterbi School of Engineering, and BS Accounting and Finance, a joint degree between Marshall and Leventhal School of Accounting.

Moreover, our Business Administration major enables students to concentrate in a business area of their interest through the following emphases: Business Analytics, Communication, Entrepreneurship & Innovation, Finance, International Relations, Leadership & Innovation, Marketing, Real Estate Finance, and Risk Management. Note that USC Marshall's entire undergraduate program has been designated STEM, thus providing international students the ability to apply for a 24-month OPT extension subject to DHS guidelines. With these varied options at their disposal, our students pursue individual interests, developing a well-rounded, multi-faceted, intellectually curious student of business. Many of our students are double majors and/or complete at least one minor.

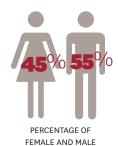

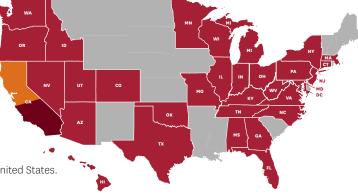
Where were our graduates **hired**?
